1. Bill Mauffray- Odonate Collection at Florida State Collection of Arthropods (FSCA), in Gainesville, FL. It's one of the largest Odonate collections in the world, with about 800,000 specimens, and an extensive library of odonate literature. Bill manages the International Odonata Research Institute (IORI), headquartered at FSCA. The collection dates back to the 1880's. 2. Dr. Melissa Sanchez Herrera- "Following the Evolutionary Footsteps of a Colorful Damselfly"- She is the President of the Dragonfly Society of the Americas; works in Colombia. She worked with Polythoridae, the Neotropical banner-wing Damselflies; genus *Polythore* has about 16 species. She works on how the species are reproductively isolated. See her website at www.polythore.com to read her research articles.

Break: Charles Haberman observed Jewelwings with high-speed video. In flight, they dip a wing into the water to pivot.

-<u>Trivia game</u> tidbits: The Latin name for the Common Green Darner, Anax junius, translates to "Master of June". There are 8 species of odonates on the US Fish and Wildlife Service endangered species list, with several in Hawaii. This includes the Hine's Emerald in Wisconsin.
